General conditions

MERCOSUR members reserve the right to extend, modify, reduce or withdraw this offer at any time prior to the conclusion of the current MERCOSUR-EU negotiations, in order to ensure a final overall balance of rights and obligations among the Parties.

MERCOSUR members further reserve the right to make technical amendments to this offer and make corrections to rectify any errors, omissions, or inaccuracies in this offer as well as to clarify and interpret the terms and conditions of this offer.

The offer remains conditional on the final text of the Services and Establishment Chapters of the Mercosur-EU agreement, as well as on the other Chapters affecting trade in services and investment where definition is still pending.

This offer was elaborated taking into account the disciplines and principles of the General Agreement on Trade in Services (GATS) of the World Trade Organization, which recognize, among other elements, the flexibility to adopt specific commitments that are differentiated in terms of sectors and modes of supply.

This offer shall not be interpreted as limitations of domestic regulation or to the introduction of new regulation with a view to achieving national policy objectives, in accordance with the Fourth Paragraph of the Preamble to GATS and the main goals of this agreement.

The offer for the individual services sectors and sub-sectors is elaborated on the basis of a positive list approach and is identified in accordance with the classification list in Document MTN.GNS/W/120 of the World Trade Organization and corresponding CPC preliminary version numbers wherever.

The offer for the non-services sectors is elaborated on the basis of a positive list approach and based on the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC – Rev.3), for Argentina, Paraguay and Uruguay. For Brazil, the offer for the non-services sectors is based on the Central Product Classification (CPC – Rev. 2) and covers only non-services sectors and/or activities (headings 0, 1, 2, 3 and 4).

Where no reference is made to one or more MERCOSUR countries for a specific sector or subsector, it should be interpreted that that country or countries are not taking any commitments for that specific sector or sub-sector.

Measures that are inconsistent with both articles on market access and national treatment are inscribed in the column relating to market access. In this case the inscription shall be considered to provide a condition or qualification to national treatment as well.

Specific conditions

Argentina:

Argentina reserves the right to use exchange rate regulations which are in conformity with the Articles of Agreement of the IMF.

Brazil: In case of doubt or divergences between the schedule of specific commitments of the non-services sectors and of the services sectors, the latter shall prevail.

For the purposes of interpretation of Brazilian commitments, the cross-border supply of services through electronic means, including the Internet, will be limited to mode 1.

Paraguay, Uruguay: This offer is based on the assumption that the MERCOSUR-EU agreement shall not interfere with existing bilateral agreements relating to taxes and tax measures or with the capacity of Mercosur countries to pursue the objectives of their fiscal policies.

- (i) "Telecommunication services" hereby means the transport of electronic magnetic signals, sound, data, image and any combination thereof, excluding broadcasting.
- (ii) The Federal Constitution of Brazil guarantees all acquired rights of service providers already established in Brazil. The Executive Branch has the legal prerogative to consider limits to foreign participation in the capital composition of telecommunication service providers.
- (iii) All service suppliers in order to supply a telecommunication service in Brazil need to obtain a licence from Anatel. Licences shall be granted only to suppliers duly constituted according to the Brazilian legislation, which requires head office and management located in the Brazilian territory, and ownership of the majority of the voting shares by natural persons resident in Brazil or companies duly constituted according to the Brazilian legislation, which requires head office and management located in the Brazilian territory.
- (iv) The present schedule does not include any commitment related to the activities which have their content transported by a telecommunication service. The content and treatment of those activities are regulated by their respective sectors.
- (v) Foreign satellites are permitted to have market access in Brazil, and regulatory decisions on this regard are based on a transparent, objective process and on a reciprocity basis. Telecommunication service providers must use Brazilian satellites, whenever they offer technical, operational or commercial conditions equivalent to foreign satellites.
- (vi) No limits shall be applied to the quantity of licenses that can be granted for the supply of telecommunications services, except in cases of technical impossibility, such as spectrum availability, or to avoid impairment to the supply of specific modalities of public interest services.
- (vii) Value Added Services are not defined as telecommunication services in the Brazilian legislation.

The system is provided in free competition category with licence granted by CONATEL, being asigned the available spectrum in all the areas of running. There is no more availability of frequencies by the moment.

Horizontal Sub-sector Provisions:

For commitments under mode 3): The establishment of financial institutions, such as, any type of banks, consumer or real estate/mortgage finance companies, credit cooperatives or companies, leasing companies, brokers and dealers, as well as increases in the participation of foreign persons (individual or firms) in the capital of financial institutions incorporated under Brazilian law, needs a specific authorization granted on a case-by-case basis by the Executive Branch, by means of a Presidential decree. Specific conditions may be required. Institutions authorized to perform financial activities may perform only authorized activities, according to domestic Laws and regulations. Representative offices may not engage in commercial business.

Note for transparency purposes regarding domestic regulation: Services included in sub-sector 7.B.1 are those currently under primary responsibility of the Central Bank of Brazil (BACEN – "Banco Central do Brasil"), and those included in sub-sector 7.B.2 are those under primary responsibility of the Brazilian Securities Commission (CVM – "Comissão de Valores Mobiliários"). Only institutions accredited by those agencies may render activities listed in this subsector.

Securities, for commitments under subsector 7.B.2, are: corporate shares, debentures, secured bonds, founder's shares (extinguished in 2001, existing ones grandfathered), coupons of these securities; subscription warrants, and rights or receipts; securities certificates of deposit; any type of derivatives, including options, forwards swaps and futures contracts; commercial paper issued by public companies, except financial institutions; open or closed-ended mutual funds, including real estate-funds (shares of real estate investment funds) any type of collective investment instrument offered to the public that creates the right of participation in profits or other type of capital remuneration.

All members of senior level management of financial services suppliers must be permanent residents in Brazil. Domicile in Brazil is needed, but this concept is non-discriminatory, as it is currently extendable to non-resident foreigners. In practice, only an address in Brazil is needed to register, working address admitted.

NOTE TO THE ARGENTINE SCHEDULE

Where road, rail, inland waterways and auxiliary services are not otherwise fully covered in this schedule, a multimodal transport operator shall have the ability to rent or lease trucks, railway carriages or barges, and related equipment to local companies for the purpose of inland forwarding of cargoes, or have access to, and use of, these forms of multimodal activities on reasonable and non-discriminatory terms and conditions for the purpose of carrying out multimodal transport operations. (« Reasonable and non-discriminatory terms and conditions » means, for the purpose of multimodal transport operations, the ability of the multimodal transport operator to arrange for the conveyance of its merchandise on a timely basis, including priority over other merchandise which has entered the port at a later date.)

DEFINITIONS

Without prejudice to the scope of activities which may be considered as « cabotage » under the relevant national legislation, this schedule does not include « maritime cabotage services », which are assumed to cover transportation of passengers or goods, including goods bound for foreign destinations, between a port located in Argentina and another port located in Argentina and traffic originating and terminating in the same port located in Argentina provided that this traffic remains within Argentina's territorial waters.
- 2. «Other forms of commercial presence for the supply of international maritime transport services » means the ability for international maritime transport service suppliers of other Members to undertake locally all activities which are necessary for the supply to their customers of a partially or fully integrated transport service, within which the maritime transport constitutes a substantial element. (This commitment shall however not be construed as limiting in any manner the commitments undertaken under the cross-border mode of delivery).

- (f) acting on behalf of the companies, organizing the call of the ship or taking over cargoes when required.
- 2. "Maritime cargo handling services" means activities exercised by stevedore companies, including terminal operators, but not including the direct

activities of dockers, when this workforce is organized independently of the stevedoring or terminal operator companies. The activities covered include the organization and supervision of:

- the loading/discharging of cargo to/from a ship;

- 2. ANNEX 3

ADDITIONAL COMMITMENTS PARAGUAY FOR FINANCIAL SERVICES

EFFECTIVE AND TRANSPARENT REGULATION IN THE FINANCIAL SERVICES SECTOR

- 1. Each Party shall publish promptly and, except in emergency situations, at the latest by the time of their entry into force, all relevant measures of general application which pertain to or affect this Annex. Such measure shall be provided:
- (a) by means of an official publication; or
- (b) in other written or electronic form.
- 2. Each Party's appropriate financial authority shall make available to interested persons its requirements for completing applications relating to the supply of financial services.
- 3. On the request of an applicant, the appropriate financial authority shall inform the applicant of the status of its application. If such authority requires additional information from the applicant, it shall notify the applicant without undue delay.
- 4. Each Party shall make its best endeavours to ensure that internationally agreed standards for regulation and supervision in the financial services sector are implemented and applied in its territory. Such internationally agreed standards are, inter alia, the Basle Committee's "Core Principle of Effective Banking Supervision", the International Association of Insurance Supervisors' "Insurance Core Principles", the International Organisation of Securities Commissions' "Objectives and Principles of Securities Regulation and the "40 recommendations from the Financial Action Task Force on Money Laundering.

MUTUAL RECOGNITION OF PRUDENTIAL MEASURES

- 1. Paragraph 2 and 3 apply with regard to mutual recognition of prudential measures in the area of financial services.
- 2. A Party may recognise prudential measures of the other Party in determining how the Party's measures relating to financial services shall be applied. Such recognition, which may be achieved through harmonisation or otherwise, may be based upon an agreement or arrangement or may be accorded autonomously.
- 3. A Party that is a party to an agreement or arrangement with a third party such as those referred to in paragraph 1, whether future or existing, shall afford adequate opportunity for the other Party to negotiate its accession to such agreements or arrangements, or to negotiate comparable ones with it, under circumstances in which there would be equivalent regulation, oversight, implementation of such regulation, and, if appropriate, procedures concerning the sharing of information between the Parties to the agreement or arrangement. Where a Party accords recognition autonomously, it shall afford adequate opportunity for the other Party to demonstrate that such circumstances exist.
