D. Intra-corporate transferees

Intra-corporate transferees includes managers, executives, senior personnel and specialists as follows:

The period of stay for this category is at least 1 (one) year up to 2 (two) years.

- (a) Executives and senior personnel persons in the organisation who primarily direct the management of the organisation. They exercise wide latitude in decision-making and receive only supervision or direction from high-level executives, the board of directors or stockholders. They do not directly perform tasks related to the provision of the service(s) of the organisation.
- (b) Managers persons in an enterprise or organisation who primarily direct a department or subdivision. They supervise and control the work of other supervisory, professionals or managerial staff. They have the authority to hire or dismiss personnel, recommend their hiring or dismissal or take other personnel action such as promotion or authorisation. Thev exercise discretionary authority over day-to-day activities. Does not include first-line supervisors unless those supervised are professionals, nor employees who primarily perform tasks required for the provision of the service.

(c)	Specialists – persons in an enterprise or
	organisation who possess knowledge at an
